### **Bear Bait Volunteer Project** Portland Area Weekdays, June 2010

The statewide black bear population study is continuing. Biologists out of the Portland office need volunteers to assist them in placing and retrieving the bear baits. Volunteers must commit to at least one full day (8:00 a.m. – ~6:00 pm) of bait placement or retrieval, and we prefer a two day commitment spaced two to three weeks apart. Volunteers need to provide their own lunches. They will ride along with staff on forest roads, walk into the forest carrying equipment, select trees, place bear bait sandwiches high in trees, and record the locations of placement. Retrieval requires the same procedures in reverse, plus you are checking to see if the bear baits were taken or eaten by other species. Volunteers need to be physically fit to hike

over uneven terrain carrying equipment. Experience reading maps and using GPS are helpful. Volunteers must be 18 years or older for this project.
